WHO SHOULD READ: All Payroll, IT and GP Practice Managers and those who generate data for SPPA
ACTION: To read, circulate and action as appropriate
SUBJECT: Reporting of strike days

The purpose of this circular is to:

- remind employers to deduct strike days from pensionable service reported for year ending 31 March 2012

The recent industrial action on 30 November 2011 will result in a reduction of the pensionable service which should be reported for the period ending 31 March 2012. This will only affect those employees who are members of the pension scheme and had "Unauthorised Leave" on that day.

The reduced service should be reflected in either the total days reported for full time employees or hours worked for part-time employees. These could either be on a NSR2 Leaver, NSR4 Group Code Change or the NSR3 Annual Return.

Any further strike days within the reporting year should also be deducted and the balance of service reported accordingly.

NB: Health Boards have agreed a reporting process with SPPA and they should continue their normal payroll procedures.
