NCB	9	First 2 digits of the account number are the last 2 digits of the branch code.
VMBS	Variable length	Non ACH Bank – Payments are made by Manager’s cheques/ Electronic file
FCIB	10	No specific pattern account number must be 10 digit number
BNS	Variable length	
JNBS	Variable length	Non ACH Bank – Payments are made by Manager’s cheques/ Electronic file
RBTT	13	First 3 digits of account number are the last 3 digits of the branch code. Next 3 digits are the product code
