THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT PENSION SCHEME AMENDMENT (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2009 (S.S.I 2009/93)

Policy Objectives

- 3. The purpose of the instrument is to make corrections and minor amendments to the following instruments which were made in 2008 and will, collectively, introduce the new Local Government Pension Scheme in Scotland from 1 April 2009:
 - The Local Government Pension Scheme (Benefits, Membership and Contributions) (Scotland) Regulations 2008 (S.S.I. 2008/230)
 - The Local Government Pension Scheme (Administration) (Scotland) Regulations 2008 (S.S.I. 2008/228)
 - The Local Government Pension Scheme (Transitional Provisions) (Scotland) Regulations 2008 (S.S.I. 2008/229)

A number of the amendments relate to corrections which the Scottish Government agreed to make following questions raised by the Subordinate Legislation Committee when the above S.S.I.s were laid. These are covered by regulations 3, 11, 14 and 15 of these Regulations.

Consultation Process
