## PARTNER NOMINATION Information notes – please detach and retain

Under the NPPS and the 2015 Police pension scheme it is not necessary to nominate a spouse or civil partner, as they are automatically entitled to survivor benefits in the event of your death. In some cases a surviving partner may also qualify for benefits. Further information can be found on our website – www.sppa.gov.uk

If you wish, you can provide SPPA with your partner's details by completing this form, which will be held on your record. However this is not a legally-binding document and is not a guarantee that your partner will automatically receive a survivor pension, as the following criteria must be met at the time of death for a partner's application to be accepted:

- you and your partner have been living together in an exclusive long term relationship for at least 2 years;
- you and your partner are free to marry or to enter a civil partnership; and
- you and your partner are financially interdependent i.e. you rely on your joint finances to support your standard of living, although you do not need to be contributing equally.

Immediately prior to your death, your relationship must have continued to meet the qualifying conditions of the regulations for the payment of a survivor's pension. Evidence of financial interdependency will be required if your partner makes a claim following your death.

## Evidence might include:

- confirmation that you lived in a shared household
- shared bank accounts or investments
- a loan or mortgage in joint names
- wills naming each other as the main beneficiary

You should contact us as soon as possible to make any changes to your partner details if your relationship comes to an end.

We will acknowledge receipt of your application using the email address supplied. We will not under any circumstances supply this to another party.
